SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING STATEMENT

This statement sets out Bank Mandiri (Europe) Ltd's (BMEL) position concerning Slavery and Human Trafficking. It is a voluntary statement pursuant to Sn. 54 of the UK Modern Slavery Act 2015, from which we are exempt.

The statement shows the steps being taken to ensure modern slavery and human trafficking do not occur in our business or our supply chain.

Bank Mandiri (Europe) Limited ("BMEL") is a wholly owned subsidiary of Bank Mandiri, Indonesia. Bank Mandiri is majority owned by the Republic of Indonesia, and listed on the Indonesian Stock Exchange. BMEL was established on 2nd August 1999, and operates from a single, London office.

BMEL is incorporated in the United Kingdom, and is authorised by the Prudential Regulation Authority and regulated by the Financial Conduct Authority and the Prudential Regulation Authority.

BMEL is a commercial, wholesale bank.

BMEL is committed to combatting slavery and human trafficking.

BMEL believes all individuals should be treated with respect, including its own employees and those in our supply chain. We are committed to a high standard of performance, supported by an open management policy and effective teamwork based on the highest standard of integrity and accountability. We care deeply about our community and environment.

Most of BMEL's Supply chains are UK based, involving professional and recruitment services, and office logistics, where we consider slavery and human trafficking risks to be low. We expect our suppliers to conduct their business in a legal and ethical manner.

When commencing or renewing services and supplies, BMEL will take account of their prospective partner's Slavery and Human Trafficking statements.

Our business and employees operate from one office in London, and are recruited in accordance with our HR policies.

BMEL operates a risk based approach to money laundering risk, and knows our customers through ongoing Customer Due Diligence.

BMEL provides staff with training about slavery and human trafficking, so that staff are aware of, and understand, the issues.
